Additionally, EPH's ownership of media outlets in the Czech Republic and France poses a significant threat to freedom of speech and democracy. "Kretinsky's control of media outlets gives him significant influence over public opinion, which is a serious threat to democracy and freedom of speech. Through his ownership of major media outlets, Daniel Křetínský has access to the political scene in both France and the Czech Republic," adds Kubala.

The report provides comprehensive research and analysis on EPH and its negative impact on climate and democracy. It sheds light on the urgent need

to transition to a sustainable, low-carbon future and hold companies like EPH accountable for their destructive actions.
